About this Service:

A house divided against itself cannot stand. Jesus makes this observation in light of charges that he is possessed. He is possessed, not by a demon, but by the Holy Spirit. We who have received the Holy Spirit through baptism have been joined to Christ's death and resurrection and knit together in the body of Christ. Those with whom we sing and pray this day are sisters and brothers of the Lord. With them we go forth in peace to do the will of God.

1 Samuel 8:4-11 [12-15] 16-20 [11:14-15]

God has settled the Israelites in the promised land and has appointed judges to govern them. But they want to be like the nations around them. By asking Samuel for a human king, they reject the kingship of God and open themselves up to oppression at the hands of the human king.

Mark 3:20-35

In response to charges that he is possessed, Jesus wonders aloud how anyone who is demon-possessed can cast out demons. Those who do the will of God are possessed by the Holy Spirit, sisters and brothers of Christ.

Driveway Repair - Capital Repair Update:

In the next couple of weeks, the Riverside Dr. end of the church driveway will be reconstructed and paved to improve the drainage. The cost of this project will be \$10,800, plus tax. There are some funds available to cover this cost, but not enough. Donations towards this project would be welcome - a square meter costs \$65. (186 square meters!) Tentative date May 22-23!
